The featured image inset is taken from the Basilica of the Visitation in Ein Karem, a village in the hill country of Judea where John the Baptist was born. The Basilica is built on the spot where the Visitation took place.

Within it is the eight-day celebration of the Lord's Nativity — known as the Christmas octave — as well as other feasts pertaining to the manifestation that Jesus is Lord of the nations. And there are feasts of several saints, many of whose stories contain special significance to the season.


