FAITH FORMATION

Immaculate Conception Church January 19, 2025




The Gospel centers on the first miracle performed by Jesus at the wedding at Cana, the initial sign of Jesus' divinity and anticipation of His passion. Mirroring the theme of marriage in the first reading, the wedding feast as the backdrop of Jesus' first miracle foretells how Jesus would bring salvation to all humankind through his sacrifice. These miracles, also termed as signs in John's gospel, are crucial in revealing Jesus' identity and power. Jesus' words to Mary, 'My hour has not come yet.', foreshadows his feelings before the Passover where He knew that the hour had come for Him to return to His Father. However, though it was not time, Jesus used His power to turn water into wine at the wedding feast. Through this, He teaches us how we should use our gifts for God's people and for the church, reiterating what St Paul reminds us about in the second reading. Mary, in the gospel, tells Jesus that there is no more wine at the wedding and asks that the servants do whatever Jesus tells them to. In this, we see her using her gift of intercession. Today, we continue to pray to Mother Mary to intercede for us.

We are called to follow Jesus' and Mary's perfect example of using the gifts for the good of the people. The abundance and quality of the wine produced by Jesus gives us a taste of the riches in the Kingdom of God promised to us. When we respond to God's call generously, God will transform our human effort into fruits for His Kingdom abundantly.

We are each called by God to be that light of Christ that breaks through the darkness. We are called to be his disciples, continually transformed by our encounter with him and sharing in his mission. Jesus came that we might have life. Part of the impetus for the Eucharistic Revival was a concern that some Catholics do not believe, or at least do not understand, that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist.

Even though our human senses perceive bread and wine, the Eucharist is Jesus—body, blood, soul, and divinity. Similarly, many people do not realize or acknowledge the sanctity of human life when it is hidden in the womb. Both instances call for us to help others recognize these sacred gifts that may not be perceivable through our human senses. We need to help others understand that just because something may not be apparent to our eyes does not mean that it is not there or that it is not important.


We live in a society that rejects those who are weak, fragile, or vulnerable. Yet, it is precisely within these conditions that a person is most in need of our care and protection. Pope Francis reminds us that "every child who, rather than being born, is condemned unjustly to being aborted, bears the face of Jesus Christ, bears the face of the Lord, who even before he was born, and then just after birth, experienced the world's rejection."




COUPLES NIGHT


