


MASS FOR THE RESPECT OF LIFE

Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all. <u>Luke 4:14–15</u>

Though Jesus was initially welcomed with praise, we know that things quickly changed. Some eventually became so hostile that they put Jesus to death, but it's useful to ponder the initial response He received. This initial response is one that must become continuously new in our lives. The initial response was that He "was praised by all."



When did you initially encounter the Gospel? For some it was during childhood. For others, there was a powerful experience of conversion later in life. Think of that initial encounter you had and the ways that you were excited by your newfound faith. Has that experience continued and grown in your life? Or has your initial praise of God and enthusiasm dwindled or even died? Ponder this experience in your life and try to see yourself as one of the people in today's Gospel who heard Jesus for the first time. Ponder their enthusiasm and join in their praise of our Lord so that you will be motivated to let God and the preaching of His holy Word continuously transform you. mycatholic life.com




Pope Francis: 'Be Messengers of Hope' With a 'Yes to Life' in Jubilee Year

Reflecting on the Prologue of John's Gospel, the Pope reminded the faithful that Jesus, the Word Incarnate, is 'the light that shines in darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.'

"Let us not be afraid to throw open bright windows of closeness to those who are suffering, of forgiveness, of compassion and reconciliation," Pope Francis said from the window of the Apostolic Palace on Jan. 5. vaticannews.com

Half a million pilgrims have already passed through the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica for the Jubilee.



I hereby declare that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the word of God. This Sunday of the Word of God will thus be a fitting part of that time of the year when we are encouraged to strengthen our bonds with the Jewish people and to pray for Christian unity. (Pope Francis, Aperuit Illis, 3)

The motto chosen by the Holy Father for the 2025 edition, within the Jubilee Year, is a verse from Psalm 119, "I hope in your Word". It is a cry of hope: man, in a moment of anguish, tribulation, and confusion, cries out to God and puts all his hope in him."

It is a deeply human experience, as is usually found in the Psalter. Everyone hopes, we all have hopes, but what is communicated to us in this Jubilee is a "Hope," in the singular. It is not an abstract idea or naive optimism, but a person, alive and present in everyone's life: Christ crucified and risen, the only one who never abandons us. Pauline theology is extremely clear on this point: "Christ Jesus our hope" (1 Tim. 1:1). This is a certainty that is placed on our path. In it we must grow without ever looking away from God's faithfulness: "Let us hold unwaveringly to our confession that gives us hope, for he who made the promise is trustworthy." (Heb. 10:23) The fact that God is faithful to his promises returns like a refrain from the Old Testament to the New Testament, and because of this we can be filled with joy and confidence. vaticannews.com




