



# FAITH FORMATION

Immaculate Conception Church February 16, 2025

The Gospel Reading today is part of the Sermon on the Plain in Luke's Gospel and His account of the Beatitudes. In the Beatitudes, we discover what the core of the Christian message is all about and how our Master wants us to live. In the Beatitudes we discover the clearest signs of those who trust in the Lord. Their lot is indeed happiness, eternal happiness! They are happy because their attitude of trust has fetched them an eternal possession of the Kingdom of God. They are satisfied and joyful because what seemed displeasing in the eyes of the world became the very things that made them pleasing before God.

It only takes a soul that places her trust in God, and not in the riches and in the transient things of this world, to live the Beatitudes. It is this same trust that illumines us to live and work with our eyes fixed on our eternal inheritance by the power of the resurrection. Such a soul will surely glory in the light of the resurrection. The resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ is the climax of the mysteries of our faith in which God manifested Himself to us as supremely and absolutely trustworthy. Faith in the resurrection is the manifestation of our trust in God, the trust that we will also share in its merits for "if Christ has not been raised, we are still in our sins" (I Cor 15:12, 16-20). www.catholicforlife.com/6th-sunday-homily-in-the-ordinary-time-year-c



# Do You Struggle with Prayer? Take Advice from the Saints

There are many definitions of prayer, but they all point to one thing: love. Prayer is a relationship that tends toward ever closer union with the loved one. In his Catechism on Prayer, Saint John Vianney used a striking image to describe the union that prayer brings about: "Prayer is nothing else but union with God.... In this intimate union, God and the soul are fused together like two bits of wax that no one can ever pull apart."

While there isn't a secret technique for praying better, there is a wisdom that the saints knew well: pray as you are able, trust in the unconditional love of God, and take the next best step to deepen your relationship with God.

If you're struggling with prayer right now, be gentle with yourself. Turn to the counsel of these saints to get your prayer back on track. eucharisticrevival.blog

# When You Feel Bored or Distracted While Praying

Saint Alphonsus de Liguori (1696–1787), founder of the Redemptorists, was given the title "Doctor of Prayer." Saint Alphonsus was a brilliant preacher and writer, yet he was masterful at presenting holiness as something within everyone's reach. He understood the particular struggles lay people have in praying and devoted much of his preaching and writing to helping them grow in the spiritual life. In his Spiritual Treatises (no. 385), he offers this simple encouragement: "This, then, is your answer whenever you feel tempted to stop praying because it seems to be a waste of time: 'I am here to please God."

Praying before the Eucharist: "Where should I pray?"

"In that little Host is the solution to all the problems of the world." St. Pope John Paul II

"Do you realize that Jesus is there in the tabernacle expressly for you – for you alone? He burns with the desire to come into your heart." St. Therese of Lisieux

Ultimately, we can find God in any situation. And we should create a space in our homes that is designated for prayer. A chair and a side table that we set aside for our time with God. Every disciple should have a sacred space in their homes where we regularly turn our hearts to God.

But we should also seek the Lord out in his eucharistic presence. Jesus is truly present — body, blood, soul and divinity — in the Eucharist. In every tabernacle, in every Catholic church — Jesus is present so that he can be close to you. St. John Paul II and St. Therese of Lisieux had a great love for Jesus in the Eucharist.
