LENT IS AROUND THE CORNER DISPOSAL OF BLESSED PALMS

Baskets for last year's Blessed Palms are at the east and west doors of the church and in the Gathering Space. Because palms are blessed by a priest and are holy objects, they should be disposed of in the proper manner. Your blessed palms will be burned, and it is the ashes from those palms that are used on Ash Wednesday.



ASH WEDNESDAY

Our Lenten journey begins Wednesday, March 5, 2025. Ash Wednesday Masses are at 8:30 a.m., 11:30 a.m., and 7 p.m. Lenten resources and Rice Bowl boxes will be at the doors next weekend.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fast and Abstinence. Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are required to fast, eating one meal along with two lesser meals which together do not equal one full meal. Liquids are permitted between meals. Catholics 14 years of age and older are obligated to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, as well as on all the Fridays of Lent.

MUSIC MINUTE – CALLING VOICES!

I have 2 questions for you to ponder.

What is the role of liturgical music in Roman Catholic Worship? How do you see yourself contributing to that role?

Simply stated, the role of liturgical music in Roman Catholic worship allows the congregation another way to actively participate in the Liturgy. Liturgical music is also described as complementing and enhancing a certain liturgy or rite. The goal of the music within the Mass is to put the spoken word into song and provide another way of hearing God's message. We come together as a community of faith to pray and worship as one, in turn we sing as a community glorifying Him through song.

As Lent approaches, I invite you to really listen to see where God is calling you in how you participate at Mass. Is He calling you to use your voice in another way to glorify Him? I invite you to join our music ministry. It does not have to be in its entirety, it can be seasonal. You can join the choir and/or you can be a cantor. Lent is the perfect time to join us to celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord. It takes an army to make this vibrant parish successful. With the demands of this faith-filled parish, it is going to take more voices to meet the requirements of our many liturgies. Ash Wednesday is March 5, and rehearsals resume Wednesday, March 12 at 7 p.m. in the choir loft.

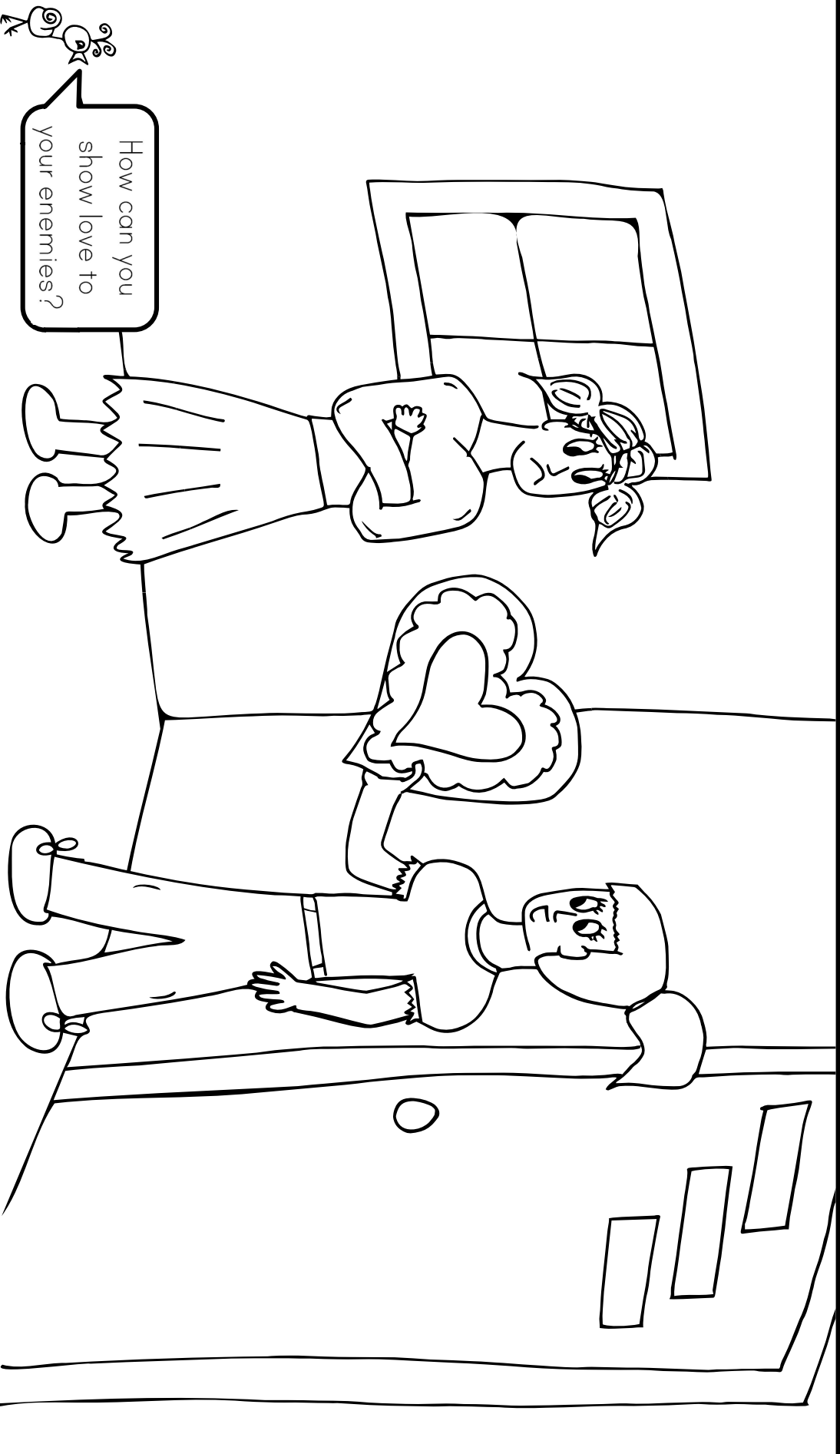
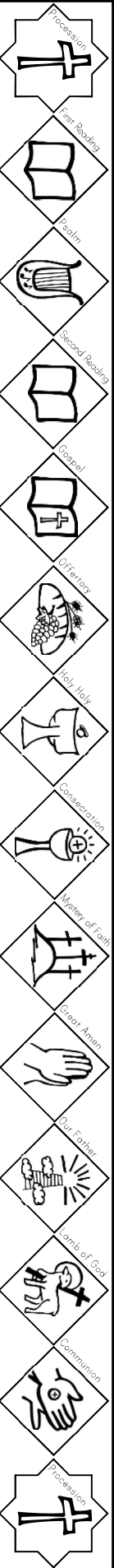

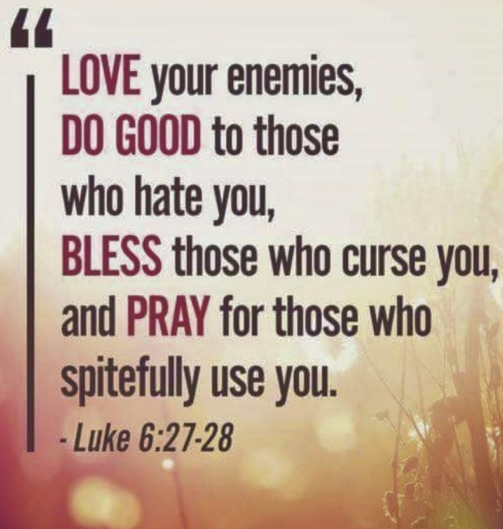
How can you show love to your enemies?

Think about the person in your life who seems unworthy of your kindness and generosity. Why are they undeserving? Are they truly undeserving? The truth, according to our Lord's teaching, is that these are not questions we should even ask ourselves. Instead, we must fully commit ourselves to loving everyone who appears to be our enemy, and do good to them and to everyone whom we encounter. Though this is difficult, it won't be if we understand the goodness that God has shown to us. God has shone us perfect goodness, not because He expected anything back, but simply because He has willed to love us. If we want to be children of God the Most High, then we must reciprocate the love given to us. That's the nature of God's love. It cannot be contained. It cannot be selfishly received without also allowing it to pour forth from our lives. When we understand this, we will understand the reason Jesus instructed us to be "kind to the ungrateful and the wicked." It is simply because this is how God has treated us.

Reflect, today, upon the unlimited love God has for you. It is beyond what you could ever comprehend. Reflect, also, upon the great benefit there is in opening yourself to God's perfect love, kindness, generosity and mercy. The benefit is that you are able to be filled with that which you receive. And as you receive this love of God, it necessarily overflows into the lives of everyone you encounter, the good and the wicked. Everyone must always be offered this love. Do not hesitate, for God does not hesitate with you.

How to Make a Plan for Lent

Before Ash Wednesday catches you unawares, make a point of sitting down—at the kitchen table, or at the chapel—and give some thought to how you want to spend this Lent.

If you have no idea where to begin, rest assured: there is a solid foundation to work from. The Church doesn't leave us to figure things out ourselves.

There are three holy practices which Catholics are called to embrace in penitential seasons such as Lent and Advent. These three practices are **prayer, fasting, and almsgiving**.

When you make your Lenten plan, choose something specific from each category—and you're set for a grace-filled journey to Easter.

Lent is the time of spiritual preparation prior to the Easter season, just as Advent is for Christmas. Jesus taught us clearly that *there is no Resurrection without the Cross*, and Lent is the Church's great spiritual journey as she, the Bride of Christ, joins her Divine Spouse in His great suffering on our behalf.



Basically, you don't get the joy of Easter without the self-sacrifice of Lent. If we are disciples of Jesus, we must follow in His footsteps...including the bloody ones. Here's a rundown of everything major you need to know about the Lenten season, the 40+ days of penance to prepare our hearts for Easter, the greatest of all Christian feasts.

It's going to be a fruitful Lent. When we're mentally and spiritually prepared, it's easier to stick with our resolutions.

Do things that help you. If you need visual reminders, consider making some for yourself. Many people benefit from the "note-on-the-bathroom-mirror" tactic. Choose a Bible verse for Lent and stay inspired that way.
