Second Sunday of Lent

"This is my chosen Son: listen to him."



This period of time, we are reminded that our own lives are a journey, for during Lent, Jesus takes us on a journey from the northernmost part of Palestine all the way down to Jerusalem. It is his final journey. It is his journey and he knows at the end of his journey, he will suffer, he will die, but he will rise again.

It's a great story. And what Luke wants us to understand, and what is passed down all through the centuries, is that the journey with Jesus is a journey that we all go together.

It is a journey that, when we embrace Jesus in faith, we walk with him to our own Jerusalem.

We walk with him through life, leading us safely home to his Father in heaven. But, along the way, there is very, very many difficulties, many troubles, many things that must be overcome.

And we must remember the brilliance of Jesus, who is almost speaking from another world, telling us: "Do not be afraid, for I have passed through all these things, and I tell you there is nothing but light, there is nothing but joy, there is nothing but a transcendence, a transfigured world, and you will make it possible if only your faith will hold." MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS FOR LENT 2025

Let us journey together in hope

Dear brothers and sisters, We begin our annual pilgrimage of Lent in faith and hope with the penitential rite of the imposition of ashes. The Church, our mother and teacher, invites us to open our hearts to God's grace, so that we can celebrate with great joy the paschal victory of Christ the Lord over sin and death, which led Saint Paul to exclaim: "Death has been swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" (1 Cor 15:54-55). Indeed, Jesus Christ, crucified and risen, is the heart of our faith and the pledge of our hope in the Father's great promise, already fulfilled in his beloved Son: life eternal (cf. Jn 10:28; 17:3). [1]

This Lent, as we share in the grace of the Jubilee Year, I would like to propose a few reflections on what it means to journey together in hope, and on the summons to conversion that God in his mercy addresses to all of us, as individuals and as a community.

Pope Francis asks us to reflect this Lent on two questions. We find these questions personally helpful and share them with you in hopes that you will too.


- 1. "Am I really on a journey, or am I standing still, not moving, either immobilized by fear and hopelessness or reluctant to move out of my comfort zone?"
- 2. "Am I seeking ways to leave behind the occasions of sin and situations that degrade my dignity?"

Let us journey together in hope, for we have been given a promise. May the hope that does not disappoint (cf. Rom 5:5), the central message of the Jubilee, [5] be the focus of our Lenten journey towards the victory of Easter. As <u>Pope Benedict XVI</u> taught us in the Encyclical <u>Spe Salvi</u>, "the human being needs unconditional love. He needs the certainty which makes him say: 'neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord' (Rom 8:38-39)". [6] Christ, my hope, has risen! [7] He lives and reigns in glory. Death has been transformed into triumph, and the faith and great hope of Christians rests in this: the resurrection of Christ!


