

MUSIC MINUTE

This Music Minute will be a new addition to our Sunday bulletin. It will appear periodically during the year, especially during the season change.

The year 2025 begins the Jubilee Holy Year. This marks the 2,025 Anniversary of the Incarnation of Our Lord. The concept of the Jubilee Year has its roots in Chapter 25 of Leviticus, calling for a special year of reconciliation, pilgrimage, and coming home. Pope Francis marks the 2025 Jubilee Year as "Pilgrims of Hope." (https://www.usccb.org/jubilee2025)

The song, "Pilgrims of Hope," was composed for this Jubilee Year by Pierangelo Sequeri and translated by Andrew Wadsworth. It is a song that expresses our daily pilgrimage on our way to the Risen Lord. Sequeri used themes in this song to reflect what is happening in the world today: themes such as fraternity, creation, God's tenderness, and hope. Sequeri also uses messages from the Prophet Isaiah of people returning from their sinful ways and coming into the light of God's Word. "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light." (Is 9:2) The light is that of the Son who became man, Jesus, who by His Word gathers every people and nation. It is the living flame of Jesus that stirs our hearts: "Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you." The choir began singing "Pilgrims of Hope" on Ash Wednesday as we journey toward the hope of the Resurrection in this Lenten season. This is a great reminder of our daily pilgrimage toward heaven.




Saint Dismas



FAITH FORMATION

Immaculate Conception Church March 9, 2025

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days, to be tempted by the devil. <u>Luke 4:1-2</u>



Consider the three temptations Jesus overcame in the desert: gluttony, vainglory and greed. Jesus' entrance into the desert for those 40 days was the way by which He destroyed these temptations before they were even presented to Him. By voluntarily choosing to fast from food for those 40 days, Jesus rendered the temptation toward gluttony ineffective. By

choosing the humility of entering into the solitude of the desert to be alone with His Father, Jesus robbed the temptation toward vainglory of its power.

By choosing a life of poverty and simplicity, He overcame any temptation toward earthly wealth, even before it was offered to Him.

As we begin this forty-day Lenten journey, reflect, today, upon the sins and temptations in your life that need to be overcome. If you find yourself in an ongoing defensive position toward certain struggles, especially if you find yourself losing the battle at times, it's time to change your strategy. Embrace the opposite virtue of the sins you are most tempted with this Lent. Embrace those virtues in an offensive manner. Choose kindness if you struggle with anger. Choose fasting if you struggle with gluttony. Choose generosity if you struggle with greed. Whatever your struggle, turn to the virtue you need the most and make it your focus this Lent so that you, too, will be well-prepared to reject the evil one and his lies when temptation comes your way. mycatholiclife.com



Prayer, Speaking to God Praying: a Pillar of Lent

Prayer is an essential component of growth in our relationship with the living God. If we have not already been incorporating prayer into our daily lives, Lent is an excellent time to start.

This season reminds us that God wants us to be reconciled to him and to one another. He wants us to shed anger, bitterness and resentments that could decay our souls. If we truly desire God's love and mercy, we must learn to humble ourselves and seek not only divine forgiveness but to establish life-giving relationships around us."

During Lent, we are called to pray as a way to connect with God and reflect on Jesus' sacrifice. Prayer helps us become attuned to God's voice, seek forgiveness and grow closer to him. It's a time for self-reflection and renewal, inviting us to align our lives with God's will. Through prayer, we find comfort, hope and strength in knowing that God is with us during our 40-day journey through Lent and beyond.

Many saints have offered their personal reflections on what prayer is and how it unites us to God:

"Prayer is a surge of the heart, it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy." — St. Therese of Lisieux

"Prayer is the raising of one's mind and heart to God or the requesting of good things from God." — St. John of Damascus "Whether we realize it or not, prayer is the encounter of God's thirst with ours.

God thirsts that we may thirst for him." - St. Augustine

Here is a beautiful prayer taken from the Sermons of St. Anthony. It's one of extreme peace and restored confidence in prayer to God.

"Prayer is directing our affections towards God; it's a devout and friendly talk with Him. It's the tranquility of a mind illumined from above."


