A RECOMMITMENT TO END HUNGER

A story of hope from Guatemala

The Belén family participates in a Catholic Relief Services project that helps fight hunger in places where people don’t have enough food. In their community, malnutrition affects more than half of the population, mainly because people can’t afford to put food on the table. Almost five years ago, when the COVID-19 pandemic started, José Belén lost his job as a driver. This created serious challenges for the family. Even after the pandemic, things never went back to normal. Food prices went up and eggs became twice as expensive. Bad weather made things worse – strong rains damaged the crops, causing the prices of vegetables, including tomatoes, onions and corn to go up. Through the Catholic Relief Services’

project, Ana Belén goes every other week to her children’s school to receive food such as corn, beans, rice, vegetable oil and eggs. Ana Belén’s family now eats nutritious meals every day. She also makes sure to take her children for monthly health check-ups, as part of the project.

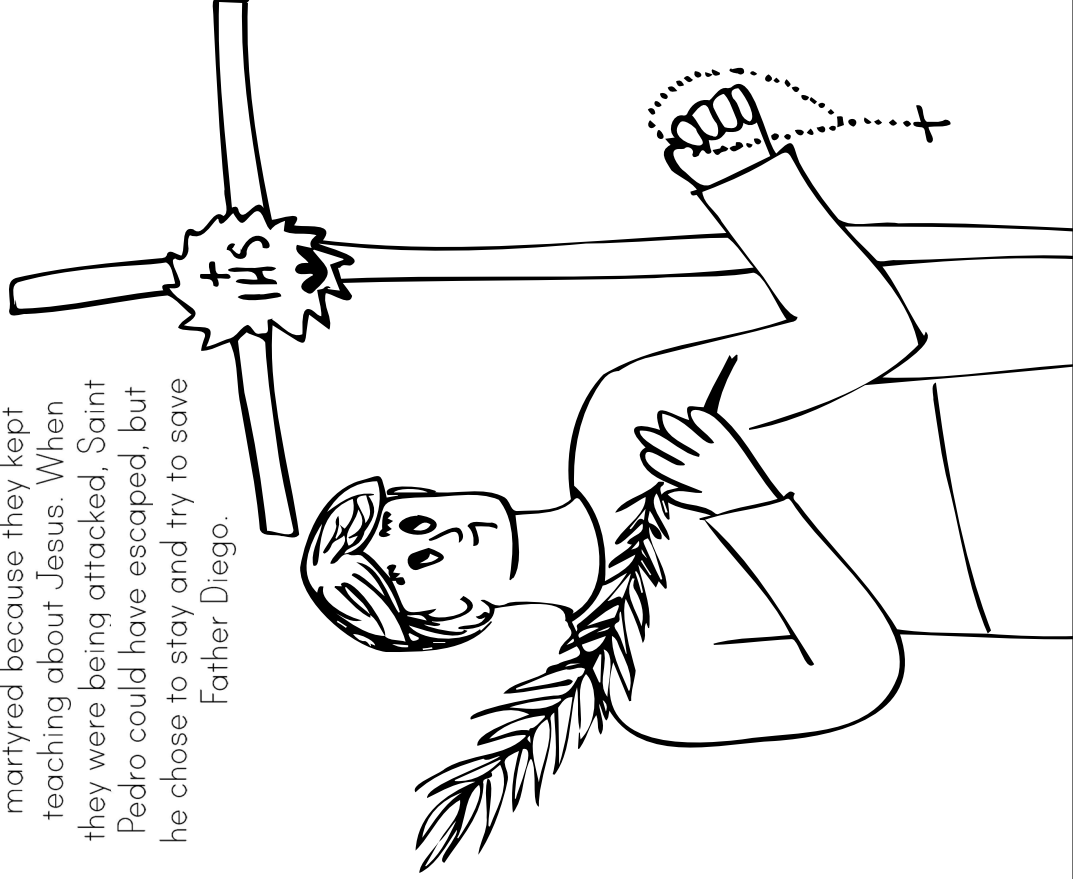

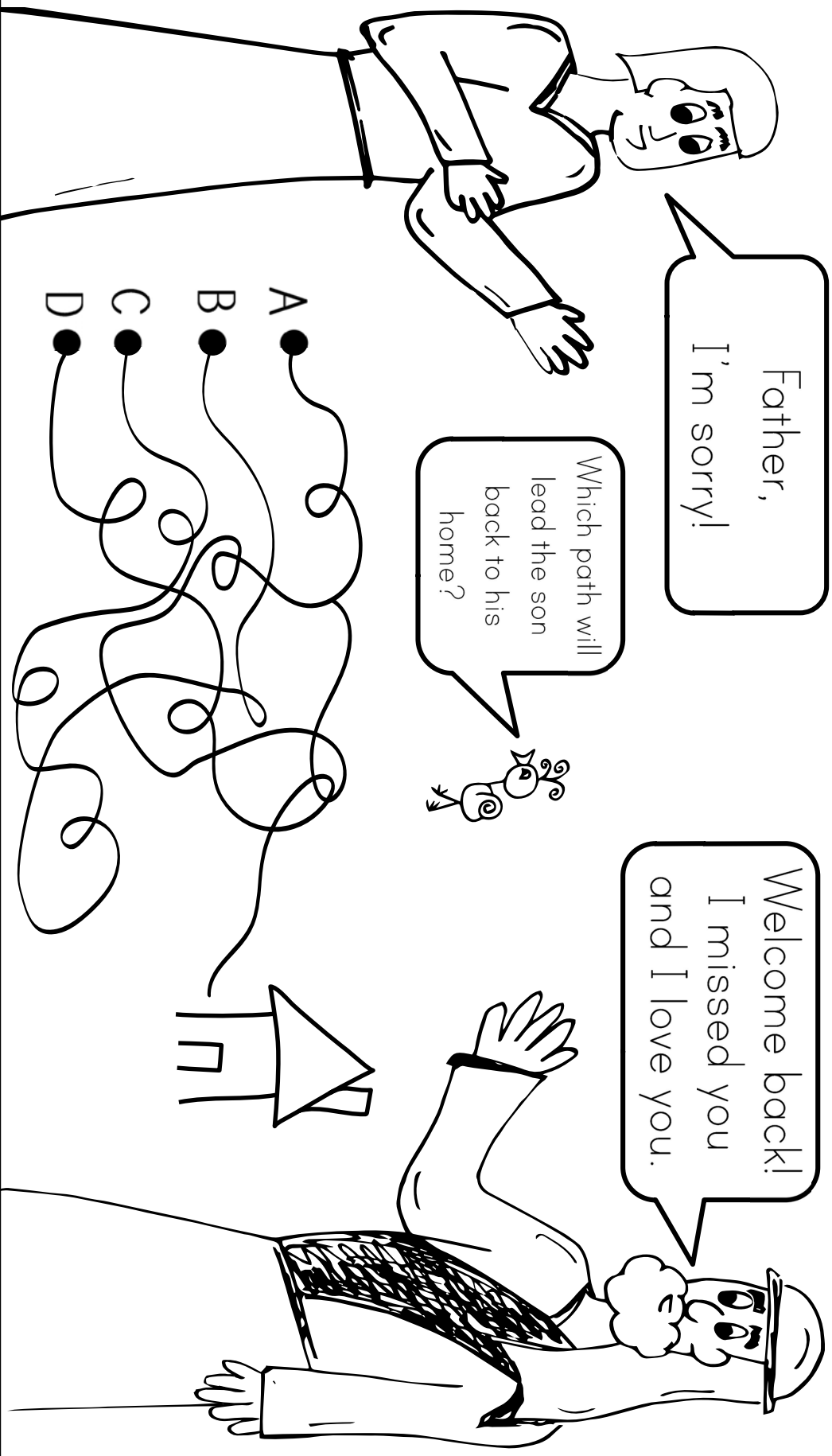
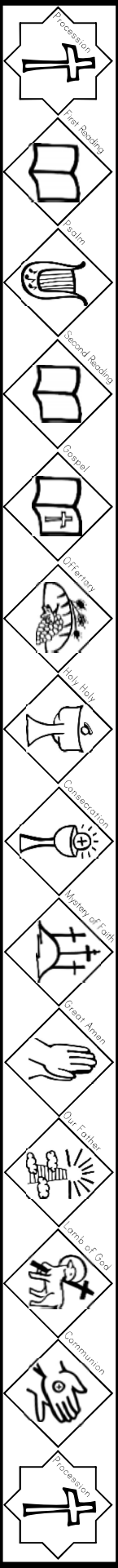

FORGIVENESS IS...

Forgiveness is given before our offenders apologize, and even if they never apologize or stop mistreating us. Forgiveness is expressed affectionately. Forgiveness means honoring our offenders by giving them special gifts and throwing a party on their behalf (Lk 15:22-23). TODAY IS LAETARE SUNDAY



As we journey through the season of Lent, a time of reflection and penance in preparation for Easter, we encounter a day known as Laetare Sunday. But what exactly is Laetare Sunday, and why is it significant?

Laetare Sunday falls on the fourth Sunday of Lent and derives its name from the Latin word "Laetare," meaning "Rejoice." This joyful spirit is reflected in the opening words of the Introit at Mass: "Laetare Jerusalem" — "Rejoice, O Jerusalem."

On Laetare Sunday, a contrast is emphasized between the somber tone of Lent and a restrained rejoicing, symbolized by certain indulgences.

The underlying message of Laetare Sunday remains consistent: a reminder to find moments of joy amidst the rigors of Lent, as we anticipate the ultimate joy of Easter. <https://catholic-trends.com/>
